Reminding all delegations of the fact that Universal Free Trade amplifies the deterioration of our environment,

Confident of the idea that establishments like the NAFTA (North American Free Trade Agreement) benefit a countries economy,

Stressing the fact that our economic system should not only serve the interests of big multinational corporations,

Noting with appreciation the World Trade Organization its economic efforts made so far,

1. Encourages the establishment of trade deals to clarify objections and prevent misunderstandings;
2. Stresses the importance of government interference in certain aspects such as, but not limited to:
 - a) standard of living, by investing in, but not limited to:
 - i. education,
 - ii. infrastructure,
 - iii. hospital care,
 - b) establishing rules, regarding, but not limited to:
 - i. taxes,
 - ii. working conditions;
3. Insists on protecting small corporations and encourage individuals to develop their businesses by means of, but not limited to:
 - a) quotas,
 - b) patents,
 - c) tax barriers,
 - d) tax reliefs for smaller businesses;
4. Urges reallocation of jobs and improving the poor working conditions in emerging market countries that do not have adequate labor protections;
5. Emphasises the need of the United Nations' interference in verifying the protection of human rights in a global trading system;
6. Calls upon a fair price for natural resources being traded and used for manufactory in the leading economic countries, in order to achieve a fair economic expansion for developing economic countries.
